Types of Submissions

The Michigan Journal of Environmental & Administrative Law (MJEAL) encourages the submission of unsolicited manuscripts for publication. MJEAL will publish unsolicited articles written by law professors, judges, practitioners, L.L.M. students, and academics from other disciplines. Additionally, MJEAL accepts submissions of unsolicited manuscripts from current University of Michigan Law School students or recent graduates, which will be automatically classified as signed "notes," according to the author's full biographical information. MJEAL does not presently accept submissions of unsolicited manuscripts from current non-University of Michigan Law School J.D. students or recent J.D. program graduates.

Submission Requirements

Each manuscript should be typed, double-spaced and generally conform to The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation and The Chicago Manual of Style. Each manuscript should be accompanied by a cover letter giving a brief overview of the manuscript and providing author contact information including name, e-mail address, phone number, and mailing address. Enclosing a résumé, a list of previous publications, and/or a vita with the submission, while not necessary, can also be helpful for MJEAL's reviewers.

Methods of Submission

Electronic Submissions. MJEAL strongly encourages electronic submission of manuscripts. An author can also choose to mail the manuscripts to MJEAL. However, MJEAL prefers electronic submissions in order to process and distribute the manuscripts more efficiently and quickly. A manuscript and accompanying materials must be formatted for any version of Microsoft Word.

If sending an article, please write in the subject line: "Article Submission: [Title of Article]"

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Once MJEAL receives the submission, an e-mail or typewritten acknowledgment letter will be sent to the author. Mailed articles cannot be returned unless accompanied by a self-addressed postage-paid envelope.
